**Larry Eisenberg** is Executive Director for Facilities Planning and Development for the Los Angeles Community College District. LACCD is the largest community college district in the United States and is currently implementing a \$5.7 billion construction and renovation program under Larry's supervision. In this capacity, Larry oversees all planning, facilities development, maintenance and real estate activities of the District. The hallmark of the LACCD program is its commitment to sustainability, making it one of the largest sustainable development programs in the world at the present time.

Larry currently serves on the sustainability advisory committees of several national organizations including the American College and University Presidents Climate Commitment, the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education, and The National Association of College and University Budget Officers. Larry received a Bachelor of Science in Urban Studies from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and a Master of Public Affairs from the LBJ School of Public Affairs, part of the University of Texas at Austin.



**Tom Porter** served as 2009 Chairman of the national DBIA organization and he remains on the Board of Directors. Before launching his own construction consulting business in November, Tom was Executive Vice President of Barton Malow Company, a \$1.6 billion national construction firm with headquarters in Southeast Michigan. Before that, Tom was General Counsel of Barton Malow and an attorney at the Dykema firm in Detroit and the US Justice Department Civil Division in Washington, DC.

Tom's experience, combining a legal background with hands-on leadership of a major contractor and design-builder, gives him an interesting vantage point on delivery models.
